Founded in 1961, the Jamaica Kennel Club (JKC) and its affiliated organizations advocate for the purebred dog as a family companion, advance canine health and well-being, work to protect the rights of all dog owners and promote responsible dog ownership.

The JKC is the primary registry body for purebred dogs in Jamaica and currently recognizes fifty six (56) breeds. As a non-profit organization, the JKC is dedicated to encouraging, guiding, and advancing the interests of purebred dogs and their responsible owners and breeders in Jamaica and promoting the knowledge and understanding of the benefits which dogs can bring to Jamaican society.

The Club registers purebred dogs, regulates dog shows and performance events, and speaks out on major issues concerning dog ownership and the health & welfare of dogs across Jamaica.

It provides registry services for all officially recognized breeds of purebred dogs, provides governance for all JKC approved shows, trial and events. Finally, the CKC is a communication organization informing all people interested in dogs.

VET CHECK

Here are some essential points to understand about canine parvovirus and the measures we can take to prevent its spread in our kennels:

Nature of the Disease: Canine parvovirus is an extremely contagious viral disease, predominantly causing hemorrhagic gastroenteritis in puppies, particularly those aged between 6 to 20 weeks.

Transmission: Infection occurs when a puppy comes into direct contact with:

- o Infected dogs
- o Feces from infected dogs
- o Surfaces contaminated by the virus from infected animals.

Impact on the Body: The virus targets rapidly dividing cells, especially in the bone marrow and small intestine, leading to immune system vulnerability, vomiting, and diarrhea. This often results in dehydration and sepsis. Common symptoms include:

- o Depression
- o Fever
- o Loss of appetite
- o Vomiting
- o Diarrhea

Diagnosis: Parvovirus is typically identified using fecal ELISA tests, which detect the presence of the virus in canine stool.

Preventative Measures: Preventing this disease is paramount, as treatment can be arduous due to the virus's aggressiveness and breed-specific susceptibilities (e.g., Doberman, Rottweiler, and Pitbull breeds). Key prevention strategies include:

- o Vaccination: This is the most crucial preventive measure. Puppies should commence vaccination at six weeks of age, with boosters every three weeks until they are at least 16 weeks old. Annual boosters are recommended thereafter.
- o Quarantine: Given the virus's highly contagious nature and durability, puppies should be kept in quarantine until fully vaccinated, avoiding exposure to areas that might be contaminated by other dogs.
- o Sanitization: Canine parvovirus is highly susceptible to bleach. A solution of one part bleach to 30 parts water is effective for sanitizing areas where the puppy will be quarantined or any space previously contaminated by the virus.

THE TRUE TOP BREEDER OF THE YEAR AWARD



This trophy has been sponsored by TRUE PET FOOD for the Top Breeder of the Year and will be first presented at the end of the year 2024, and annually thereafter.

The scoring of points will take into consideration the JKC Spring and Autumn All-Breed Shows and the All-Breed Show put on by the Breed Clubs. Breed shows such as the German Shepherd, Doberman and Rottweiler specialties will not be taken into consideration in the scoring, so as to give all breeds an equal opportunity.

The award will be granted to the local breeder which has amassed the most points throughout one (1) calendar year. In order for the points won at any show to be allocated for the award, the dog winning the points MUST be registered as being bred by the breeder to whom the points will be allocated. There will be an exception made for pending registrations. That is any dog shown with a pending registration that has won points towards the award will have those points awarded to the person in whose name the dog was entered as breeder on the day of the show.

Please note that this award is only for local breeders.

Points will be allocated on the following basis:

- Challenge Certificate 5 points per show
- Reserve Challenge Certificate 3 points per show
- Best in Show 25 points per show
- Reserve Best in Show 20 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show 15 points per show
- Best Puppy in Show 10 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Show 8 points per show

Note, if the same animal wins Reserve Best in Show and Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show, only points for Reserve Best in Show will apply.

THE TRUE TOP KENNEL OF THE YEAR AWARD



This trophy has been sponsored by TRUE PET FOOD for the Top Winning Kennel of the Year and will be first presented at the end of the year 2024, and annually thereafter.

The scoring of points will take into consideration the JKC Spring and Autumn All Breed Shows and the All-Breed Show put on by the Breed Clubs. Breed shows such as the German Shepherd, Doberman and Rottweiler specialties <u>will not</u> be taken into consideration in the scoring, so as to give all breeds an equal opportunity.

The award will be granted to the kennel which has amassed the most points throughout one (1) calendar year. In order for the points won at any show to be allocated for the award the dog winning the points **MUST** be registered in the name of the owner of the kennel on the day that the dog won the points. There will be an exception made for pending registrations. That is any dog shown with a pending registration that has won points towards the award will have those points awarded to the person in whose name the dog was entered as owner on the day of the show.

Points will be allocated on the following basis:

- Challenge Certificate 5 points per show
- Reserve Challenge Certificate 3 points per show
- Best in Show 25 points per show
- Reserve Best in Show 20 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show 15 points per show
- Best Puppy in Show 10 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Show 8 points per show

Note, if the same animal wins Reserve Best in Show and Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show, only points for Reserve Best in Show will apply.

The JKC registration process as a tool



The Jamaica Kennel Club (JKC) has as its goal the preservation, improvement and promotion of the various dog breeds in Jamaica. As part of that goal we encourage registration of all purebred dogs. As such, our constitution and rules, and in fact our FB page is designed with the primary objective of the Club pursuing those goals. Persons are always asking why a registered vs an unregistered dog, what's the difference? This has recently brought into question why it is that we promote and encourage the use of registration. In effect, why a registered vs an unregistered dog? To answer that question, one must first understand what is registration.


What is registration?

Registration is the process by which each puppy is recorded in an organization's (e.g. The Jamaica Kennel Club) registration database. The database issues and keeps records of the name of the breed, colour, date of birth, sex, registered pedigree name (this includes the kennel name followed by the dog's official registered name), Jamaica Kennel Club registration number, microchip number (if applicable), name and address and signature of the breeder and owner. Five generations of ancestors are recorded by registered pedigree name and whether a dog has achieved championship status, working trials titles, obedience titles etc. Health status, where applicable Hip/Elbow scores and Haemophilia testing as examples.

Registration as a breeding tool.

Other than the obvious advantage of identifying yourself as the legal owner of a dog having regard to being registered as the owner of an identifiable dog, there are other advantages to registration. The main advantage of registration is identity and traceability of a puppy's ancestors and the breeder's details. Serious breeders would appreciate that this database of traceability is critical in breeding dogs of high quality that are also healthy. Serious breeders know and appreciate that the results from breeding is not solely determined by the sire and dam which is right in front of the breeder's eyes, but also by the ancestors of the sire and dam. As such, it goes without saying that the record of generations of parentage carry a heavy influence in decisions breeders make in who to mate their dogs to. In general, though it is not a determinative factor, serious breeders who care to breed high quality and healthy dogs tend to have and use is also recorded to include DNA, registration databases in their breeding programme.
