The JKC is the primary registry body for purebred dogs in Jamaica and currently recognizes fifty six (56) breeds. As a non-profit organization, the JKC is dedicated to encouraging, guiding, and advancing the interests of purebred dogs and their responsible owners and breeders in Jamaica and promoting the knowledge and understanding of the benefits which dogs can bring to Jamaican society.

The Club registers purebred dogs, regulates dog shows and performance events, and speaks out on major issues concerning dog ownership and the health & welfare of dogs across Jamaica.

It provides registry services for all officially recognized breeds of purebred dogs, provides governance for all JKC approved shows, trial and events. Finally, the CKC is a communication organization informing all people interested in dogs.



VET CHECK

The Canine Vacuum: Dogs that Pick Up Everything

THE CANINE VACUUM: DOGS THAT PICK UP EVERYTHING

They say a dog is a man's best friend, they provide us with companionship, entertainment and teach us responsibility. However they do have a knack for getting themselves in trouble, and one of the most common ways is eating things they aren't supposed to. Mango seeds are probably the most common thing vets in Jamaica remove from dog's intestines. As a veterinarian, the most "interesting" thing I have had a puppy ingest was not one, not two but three pacifiers!

Thankfully the pup was able to pass them out, but this is not always the case. While some materials can pass out with some oral mineral oil, oftentimes surgery is required to remove objects from the stomach or intestine. Also some objects may cause damage while passing through and are best removed. We can help minimize the likelihood of our dog's ingesting strange things by teaching commands like leave it and drop it.

We can also give them healthy avenues to explore so they are less bored. Simply scattering food or treats and having them search for them or using snuffle mats provides simple enrichment for our dogs.

While our canines are often the culprits in these cases, moving around like a vacuum cleaner and inhaling everything in their path, sometimes as owners we contribute to the issue. The most challenging surgery I have had to do was removing an oxtail bone that got stuck in a dog's throat. Trying to get to a dog's oesophagus which is right next to major vessels and the windpipe is not for the faint of heart! Thankfully this patient also recovered.

THE CANINE VACUUM: DOGS THAT PICK UP EVERYTHING

Having that experience early in my career has solidified my stance on not giving dogs bones. Particularly in our Jamaican culture it can be very difficult to convince owners that their favourite pet shouldn't get a bone as a treat. However I've seen enough bones stuck in mouths, bloody stools and worried owners that I advise against it.

So how can you know if your dog has ingested something?

As a good dog owner you are likely to notice subtle changes in your pet's appetite or behaviour. You may notice reluctance to eat or discomfort when chewing if there is something caught in the actual mouth. Smelly breath and drooling are also commonly seen. If there is something in the stomach or intestine, that may cause vomiting and sometimes diarrhea. If your pet is repeatedly vomiting a veterinary visit is necessary. You should always be concerned if you see blood in your pet's vomit or stool. Your friendly neighborhood vet will do a physical examination, and may sometimes be able to feel a foreign body in the intestines

It is highly likely however, that an ultrasound or x-ray will be needed. As you may imagine treatment costs can be quite high with intravenous fluids, injections, hospitalization and oftentimes surgery. So when you sit down to eat your Christmas meal and your dog gives you those pleading eyes please leave the bones out of any treats!



Kerlford Kennels

In the early 1950's Margaret and Barry Beckford while living in London fell in love with a German Shepherd owned by their landlord and resolved that as soon as they could they would own their own GSD.



On coming to Jamaica in 1959 they soon after purchased their 1st GSD Susan, this cemented their lifelong love of the breed. In 1968 on a visit to England they purchased Saphillian Nizam and Silkenwood Autumn



Nizam would become the base of a breeding program that was to last for approximately 40 years producing many Jamaican Champions and being the foundation of many others breeding programs. Unfortunately, Autumn developed Ricketts on the boat ride from England and so was never bred.

Their 1st mating was to Ch Shootersway Vigilant (English import owned by Derek and Hermione Chang) which produced Ch Kerlford's Vigilant Bella who was the 1st of the many Kerlford Champions.



Kerlford dogs were known for their good movement and sold temperaments. In 1973 the German Shepherd Club of Jamaica was formed and Barry was an Executive member, President Ossie Delcambre and Secretary Shirley Hing, and Margaret were Charter Members. They remained members for many years, helping organize dog shows and many social events from days at the beach to fun matches.

Margaret was the brain behind the Kerlford breeding program and general care of the dogs, spending much time studying the breed and being well informed on what was happening elsewhere in the GSD world.



At times they had as many as 12 GSD running on the lawns at Russell Heights. Barry was the expert at helping with the mating process, showing and obedience training, it was often asked in jest of Barry "do you know the name of the dog you are handling?"

The Kerlford Shepherds were all part of the family and children Jacky and Alan were often seen handling at shows. Barry passed in 2017, Margaret at 91 has many fabulous memories of her life with her Kerlford Shepherds.

Who Will Win?

THE TRUE TOP BREEDER OF THE YEAR AWARD



This trophy has been sponsored by TRUE PET FOOD for the Top Breeder of the Year and will be first presented at the end of the year 2024, and annually thereafter.

The scoring of points will take into consideration the JKC Spring and Autumn All-Breed Shows and the All-Breed Show put on by the Breed Clubs. Breed shows such as the German Shepherd, Doberman and Rottweiler specialties will not be taken into consideration in the scoring, so as to give all breeds an equal opportunity.

The award will be granted to the local breeder which has amassed the most points throughout one (1) calendar year. In order for the points won at any show to be allocated for the award, the dog winning the points MUST be registered as being bred by the breeder to whom the points will be allocated. There will be an exception made for pending registrations. That is any dog shown with a pending registration that has won points towards the award will have those points awarded to the person in whose name the dog was entered as breeder on the day of the show.

Please note that this award is only for local breeders.

Points will be allocated on the following basis:

- Challenge Certificate 5 points per show
- Reserve Challenge Certificate 3 points per show
- Best in Show 25 points per show
- Reserve Best in Show 20 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show 15 points per show
- Best Puppy in Show 10 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Show 8 points per show

Note, if the same animal wins Reserve Best in Show and Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show, only points for Reserve Best in Show will apply.



THE TRUE TOP KENNEL OF THE YEAR AWARD



This trophy has been sponsored by TRUE PET FOOD for the Top Winning Kennel of the Year and will be first presented at the end of the year 2024, and annually thereafter.

The scoring of points will take into consideration the JKC Spring and Autumn All Breed Shows and the All-Breed Show put on by the Breed Clubs. Breed shows such as the German Shepherd, Doberman and Rottweiler specialties <u>will not</u> be taken into consideration in the scoring, so as to give all breeds an equal opportunity.

The award will be granted to the kennel which has amassed the most points throughout one (1) calendar year. In order for the points won at any show to be allocated for the award the dog winning the points **MUST** be registered in the name of the owner of the kennel on the day that the dog won the points. There will be an exception made for pending registrations. That is any dog shown with a pending registration that has won points towards the award will have those points awarded to the person in whose name the dog was entered as owner on the day of the show.

Points will be allocated on the following basis:

- Challenge Certificate 5 points per show
- Reserve Challenge Certificate 3 points per show
- Best in Show 25 points per show
- Reserve Best in Show 20 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show 15 points per show
- Best Puppy in Show 10 points per show
- Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Show 8 points per show


Note, if the same animal wins Reserve Best in Show and Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Show, only points for Reserve Best in Show will apply.



How Breed Standards Work

BASIC ANATOMY

A breed standard is a set of quidelines which is used to ensure that the animals produced by a breeder conforms to the specifics of the standardized breed.




of the animal. Breed standards help define the ideal animal of a breed and provide In essence a breed standard is a blueprint for an animal fit

for the function it was bred - i.e. herding, tracking etc. Breed standards are not scientific documents, and may vary from association to association, and from country to country, even for the same species and breed. There is no one format for breed standards across all species, and breed standards do change and are updated over time.


standards cover the externally observable qualities of the animal such as appearance, movement, and temperament. The exact format of the breed standard varies, as breed standards are not scientific documents and change as the needs of the members of the organization which authors them change.

In general, a breed standard may include history of the breed, a narrative description of the breed, and details of the ideal externally observable structure and behavior for the breed.



Certain deviations from the standard are considered faults. A large degree of deviation from the breed standard, an excess of faults, or certain defined major faults, may indicate that the animal should not be bred, although its fitness for other uses may not be impeded by the faults.

An animal that closely matches (conforms to) the breed standard for its species and breed is said to have good conformation
