The JKC is the primary registry body for purebred dogs in Jamaica and currently recognizes fifty six (56) breeds. As a non-profit organization, the JKC is dedicated to encouraging, guiding, and advancing the interests of purebred dogs and their responsible owners and breeders in Jamaica and promoting the knowledge and understanding of the benefits which dogs can bring to Jamaican society.

The Club registers purebred dogs, regulates dog shows and performance events, and speaks out on major issues concerning dog ownership and the health & welfare of dogs across Jamaica.

It provides registry services for all officially recognized breeds of purebred dogs, provides governance for all JKC approved shows, trial and events. Finally, the JKC is a communication organization informing all people interested in dogs.




#### **Heartworm Disease**

Knowing about heartworms and how to prevent them is essential information for every dog owner. Heartworm disease is fatal and many dogs, initially affected, do not show signs until the later stages of the disease

#### Overview

Heartworms are blood-borne parasites that are transmitted by mosquitoes. Adult heartworms can grow up to several inches long in the heart and in adjacent large blood vessels. They can create blockages, destruct and decrease circulation in the heart, lungs and other vital organs. The female heartworm can reproduce and increase the worm burden as time goes by without treatment.

#### Clinical Signs



- Coughing
- Exercise intolerance
- Weight loss
- Shortness of breath
- Listlessness
- Swollen abdomen due to fluid accumulation

#### Diagnosis

Heartworm disease can be diagnosed by a rapid ELISA antigen test that can be performed on-site.

#### Prevention

Treatment for heartworms can be expensive, precarious and lengthy. Prevention is vital in maintaining your dog's health. Prevention can be in the form of a monthly oral preventative such as Heartgard Plus or by an injectable form administered by your veterinarian.

# JKC SEGENDS SPOTLIGHT

Interview with Peter Phillips

We talk with Peter Phillips of Phillsburgh Kennels on his experience in showing and breeding dogs. Peter also provides tips and tricks for dog showing.

# Phillsburg Kennels

Phillsburg Kennels owned by R. Peter Phillips was one of the successful kennels in Jamaica throughout the late 1970's and 1980s. Phillsburg started breeding in 1976, later that year Peter joined the German Shepherd Club of Jamaica and would go on to serve on the club's Executive Committee.

Phillsburg's kennel first mating was their female Daimler of Strathmore to the imported dog Ronden's Flashman of Shortridge. This mating produced Champion Pancho of Phillsburgh, a Best in Show winner. Pancho was the only pup of three in the litter that survived. Pancho made up his championship in under a year and this motivated Peter to get more involved in German Shepherds and the German shepherd Club of Jamaica. Peter then made the decision to acquire Pancho's father, the imported Ronden's Flashman of Shortridge, known as "Sabu". It was under Peter's ownership that Flashman actually made up his Championship title. It is from the Flashman line that Phillsburgh produced their Champions such as:

- Ch. Spring Quai Yoko at Phillsburgh
- Ch Phillsburg Manki Poo
- Champion Menashe of Phillsburg.

Phillsburgh Kennels was well know for having their dogs in top condition come show days. Peter himself was also quite a great handler of dogs of all breeds.

The Jamaica Kennel Club salutes Phillsburg Kennels for their contribution to dog showing and breeding in Jamaica. It is fitting that the German Shepherd Club of Jamaica, Best in Show Trophy is named "The Phillsburgh Trophy".

Hopefully, we have some young "Phillsburgh" kennels in the making to keep the flag flying for all breeds in Jamaica.

### **Q&A with Phillsburg**

#### **Peter Phillips**

"On behalf of Phillsburgh Kennels, having bred German Shepherds, Rottweilers, Akitas, Labradors, Dobermans, and Spaniels, it has been the joy of my life to participate in and serve at the JKC Rottweiler, German Shepherd, and Doberman Clubs. Being asked to do this interview is truly a privilege, and I am deeply humbled."

# Q1. How long have you been breeding dogs, and what led you to start?

I've been involved with dogs all my life but started breeding registered dogs around 1976. My initial motivation was security, as I lived in Stony Hill and experienced breakins.

# Q2. What challenges have you encountered in your breeding career, and how have you overcome them?



Initially, I faced a lack of knowledge. A turning point came when I visited a family member in Singapore and attended a dog show there. It completely opened my mind. I then dedicated myself to learning everything I could about breeding traits, faults, and genetics.

# Q3. Can you share a particularly rewarding experience from your time as a breeder?

One experience stands out, and it was more luck than management—pure instinct and gut feeling. At a dog show at Sabina Park, I saw an imported dog named Rondnens Flashman of Shortridge, known as Sabu, shown by his owner, Mr. Chang. I was blown away. I later acquired a registered bitch named Daimler of Strathmore, whose ears never stood erect. I mated her with Sabu, resulting in three pups, though only one survived. That pup, my first champion, Pancho of Phillsburgh, changed my life entirely. Incidentally, I eventually acquired Sabu, who became my foundation stud, producing many champions across four different breeds.

#### Q4. What qualities do you think make a successful breeder?

Knowledge is power. A successful breeder should have an eagerness to learn and continuously expand their knowledge. It's crucial to research thoroughly, especially when selecting breeding pairs, to complement the bitch and improve any faults, thus bettering the breed. Following breeding standards and staying updated on global changes, especially concerning structure and conformation, is also essential.



# Q5. What advice would you give to someone just starting out in dog breeding?

My best advice is to seek as much information and guidance as possible from experienced breeders. Finding a knowledgeable mentor you can trust is invaluable.

# Q6. What are common mistakes that new breeders make, and how can they be avoided?

A common mistake is the lack of proper research. New breeders often breed within their own kennel out of convenience rather than seeking outside breeding options that would enhance the breed.

# Q7. How important is mentorship in breeding, and would you recommend finding a mentor?

Mentorship is vital. I was fortunate to be mentored by some of the best, including Ossie Decambre, who was a tough taskmaster, especially regarding mating. I also had the privilege of learning from Alfred Campbell, Tony Rothery, Owen Munro, and the one-of-a-kind Ken King.

# Q8. What are the most important aspects to focus on when selecting breeding dogs?

When selecting breeding dogs, it's essential to evaluate the faults of the bitch and find a stud dog that complements her. Research is crucial, as is discussing your choices with knowledgeable mentors and reputable breeders.

### Q9. What are some tips and tricks for preparing your dog before a show?

Preparation is key. My dogs were always physically fit, with a lot of focus on building muscle tone through treadmill work and running. Attending handling classes is a must to acclimatize the dog and provide exposure—an area that I find sadly lacking at shows today. In fact, I believe there should be a rule stipulating that to enter a show, one should attend at least 3 of the 5 handling classes. Coat condition is also vital and should be addressed weeks before the show, with Vitamin E and fish oil supplements. Important to remember that dental care, and a bath the day before the show to ensure the coat is in top condition is crucial.







# HOW DOG SHOWS WORK

#### Dog Shows and Judging

Each dog at a dog show is presented to a judge by a handler. This person is known as the exhibitor or the handler of the dog.

The purpose of conformation shows (also known as dog shows) is to evaluate breeding stock against the standard of the breed and against each dog presented in the ring. Judges select winners based on their ability to contribute and improve the next generation of dogs. Dogs start out in the classes competing for points toward their championship title. Dogs win Challenge Certificates or Reserve Challenge Certificates. A Challenge Certificate is worth 5 points while a Reserve Challenge Certificate is worth 3 points. It takes fifteen points, including one Challenge Certificate, awarded by at least three different judges, to become a Jamaican champion.

#### **Best of Breed**

The dog that is judged Best of Breed that day.

#### **Best of Opposite Sex**

The best dog that is the opposite sex to the Best of Breed winner.

Dog shows are a process of elimination. Only the Best of Breed winners advance to compete in the Group competitions.

In Jamaica the Best of Breed winners advance to the Best in Show competition. From among these the judge selects the Best in Show winner.

When a judge enters the ring, he or she is judging each dog against a written standard describing the ideal dog. She is determining which dog comes closest to the ideal in each breed. The standards are created by the breed's national breed club in this country. Dogs were originally bred to do specific jobs whether herding, hunting, guarding, tracking, or companionship. The standard describes how a dog should look in order to carry out its job. They describe things like general appearance, movement, temperament, and specific physical traits such as height and weight, coat, colors, eye color and shape, ear shape and placement, feet, tail, and more. Each judge, applying their interpretation of the standard, gives their opinion on that day on which dog best represents its breed.

These trophies have been sponsored by True Pet Food to The Jamaica Kennel Club for the Top Breeder and Kennel of the year. The trophies will be presented annually at the end of each year.

The scoring of points will take into consideration every All Breed Show, including those All Breed Shows put on by the Breed Clubs, such as the German Shepherd, Doberman, and Rottweiler Clubs. The scoring will not, however, take into account any breed specialty show so as to give all breeds an equal opportunity.


# Dog of the Year Points Standing
